Speaker Biographies



Brian graduated Michigan State University in 1993 with a Bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering. After completing the AFROTC program, he was commissioned into the US Air Force as a second lieutenant upon graduation and was assigned to the Air Force Office of Special Investigations (AFOSI). Then earning his Master's degree in Forensic Sciences from The George Washington University in 1999 he was assigned to AFOSI as a Forensic Science Consultant. He joined the AAFS in 1999 as a student member promoting up to achieve Fellow in 2016. In 2003, Brian was hired by the FBI. After attending the FBI new agent training, he was assigned to the FBI Chicago

Division where he has worked the past 19 years conducting investigations on terrorism, violent crime, gangs, fraud and public corruption. In 2005 he joined the Evidence Response Team and became a team leader in 2007 and the Chicago Division Senior Team Leader in 2021.



Scott Hahn, DMD graduated from the University of Georgia with a bachelor in Zoology and Marine Biology. He earned his Doctorate of Medical Dentistry from the Medical College of Georgia School of Dentistry. Scott served 30 years as a US Navy Dental Officer, retiring as a Captain / 0-6 Commanding Officer VTU-0808G. Scott worked as an FBI Special Agent for 20 years, retiring as Senior Team Leader of the Miami, Florida Evidence Recovery Team (ERT). Today Scott is the Founder and CEO of Azimuth Tactical Group, providing forensic and tactical medical services and consulting.



Dr. Corinne D'Anjou graduated from Laval University in 2002 and completed a certificate in Forensic Dentistry from McGill University in 2013, followed by a Fellowship in Forensic Odontology from the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio in 2016.

She is a Fellow of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences; a Diplomate of the American Board of Forensic Odontology and she is a Canadian Representative for INTERPOL with the DVI odontology working group. Working full time in forensic dentistry, she is the chief forensic odontologist at the Laboratoire de Sciences Judiciaires et de Médecine Légale for the Quebec province.



James is an active and experienced forensic odontologist in New Zealand. He is the current president of the New Zealand Society of Forensic Odontology. James has been involved with the Christchurch Earthquake, the Mosque Shootings, and the White Island Volcano DVIs, and in 25 years of practice he has been involved in the identification of hundreds of individuals. His interests lie particularly with the ethical application of age estimation to living individuals and the current usefulness of bitemarks. He is passionate about learning from colleagues, belonging to several international societies and associations, and he is an examiner in forensic odontology with the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia. James is the first AAFS Fellow in the odontology section from the southern hemisphere and he has been a member of the ASFO for more than ten years.



Dan served 20 years in the U.S. Air Force as a dental laboratory technician. He has served the Armed Forces Medical Examiner System for the past 25 years as a member of the military, contractor, and currently as a civil service employee. He has supported dozens of mass fatalities and helped to process over 10,000 sets of remains. He has supported the bombing of the Embassies in Kenya, the bombing of the USS Cole, the Fort Hood massacre, the 9/11 attack on the Pentagon, The Space shuttle Disaster, earthquake in Haiti, attack on Benghazi and Operation's Iraqi/Enduring Freedom. He also serves as a consultant in forensic dentistry and has trained over 50 medical examiner offices throughout the country. Briefed congressional members and representatives on advances in forensic technologies for victim identification during mass disasters. He served as

the laboratory coordinator for the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology Forensic Dentistry Course and has served as a speaker on the topics of Forensic Dentistry and Forensic Dentistry Database Management for Mass Disasters. Dan is the recipient of the 2021 Haskell M. Pitluck Award presented by the American Board of Forensic Odontology given to a non-odontologist that has served the ABFO community in an exemplary fashion.



Commander Eliot grew up in Lexington, Kentucky, and attended Centre College (BS, 1996). He attended the University of Kentucky College of Health Sciences (BS and MS PT, 2002) and practiced Physical Therapy in acute care and rehabilitation centers for two years. Commander Eliot was commissioned as an Ensign in the Naval Reserves in 2004 and attended the University of Kentucky College of Dentistry (DMD, 2008) on a Health Professions Scholarship. He was commissioned as an active duty Lieutenant in 2008 and reported to residency training in Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology at the Naval Postgraduate Dental School (NPDS) in Bethesda, Maryland. At NPDS, he earned a Master of Health Science degree from The George Washington University and his certificate in Oral Pathology (2011). Following residency, he completed a one-year fellowship in Head and Neck Pathology at the Joint

Pathology Center in Silver Spring, Maryland (2012).

In 2012, Commander Eliot transferred to the Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command (later the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency), Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Hawaii, to serve as a staff Forensic Odontologist in the Central Identification Laboratory.

In 2016, Commander Eliot resumed duties as an Oral and Maxillofacial Pathologist at Naval Medical Center Portsmouth (NMCP), Virginia. In 2017, he was selected to serve as the Associate Director for Dental Services at NMCP and held the position until his permanent change of station in 2019. Dr. Eliot served as a staff Oral and Maxillofacial Pathologist at the Naval Postgraduate Dental School in Bethesda, Maryland, from 2019-2020.

In the Fall of 2019, Commander Eliot was selected to attend the College of Naval Warfare (Joint Professional Military Education, Phase 2) program at the Naval War College in Newport, Rhode Island, earning a Master of Arts degree in National Security and Strategic Studies.

Commander Eliot is currently the Director for Dental Services for Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command Pearl Harbor, Hawaii.

Commander Eliot is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology, a Fellow of the American Academy of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology, a Fellow of the American College of Dentists, and a member of the American College of Healthcare Executives. He holds an academic appointment as an Assistant Professor at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences. His military decorations include a Defense Meritorious Service Medal, a Meritorious Service Medal, a Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, a Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, and multiple unit awards.
